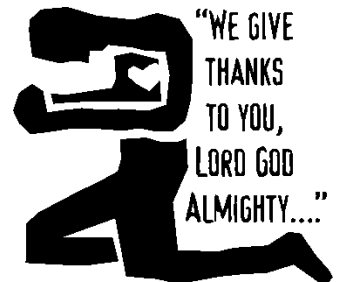

 - (3.) talking only to the PEOPLE WE DON'T KNOW for the first three minutes after worship, knowing that it is a prime time for visitors to slip out without being greeted by anyone except the person stationed at the door.

Stephen Ministry

Listening is the primary way Stephen Ministers provide care. Dr. Rachel Naomi Remen is a nationally recognized medical reformer and educator who sees the practice of medicine as a spiritual path. She is one of the earliest pioneers in the mind/body holistic health movement and the first to recognize the role of the spirit in health and the recovery from illness. Here is how Dr. Remen describes the practice of listening. *"Listening is the oldest and perhaps the most powerful tool of healing. It is often through the quality of our listening and not the wisdom of our words that we are able to effect the most profound changes in the people around us. When we listen, we offer with our attention an opportunity for wholeness. Our listening creates sanctuary for the homeless parts within the other person. That which has been denied, unloved, devalued by themselves and others. That which is hidden.*

In this culture the soul and the heart too often go homeless. Listening creates a holy silence. When you listen generously to people, they can hear the truth in themselves, often for the first time. And in the silence of listening, you can know yourself in everyone. Eventually you may be able to hear, in everyone and beyond everyone, the unseen singing softly to itself and to you."

Our son, Max, was baptized at Maple Grove and we have been so grateful for the loving support we have received from our church family through the challenging early years of parenting and the struggles we experienced as parents to a child with some developmental concerns, as well as a severe food allergy. I hope that serving the church in this new capacity, I can give back what has been given to me, the acknowledgement and support that we are one in the spirit.

I have been back in Columbus solidly for the last 18 years. My last work experience was as the City Clerk for Powell, OH. I left that job when my children were small and I felt a new calling when my youngest child entered elementary school, I to go back to school to achieve the goal of working with children and families now that they are both in school. In September, I graduated from Columbus State with an Associate of Sciences Degree in Early Childhood Education.
